## **April 2022**

"Let me sing for my beloved my love song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. He dug it and cleared it of stones and planted it with choice vines; he built a watchtower in the midst of it and hewed out a wine vat in it; and he looked for it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes." Isaiah 5:1-2

Every year Grandma and Grandpa Barlau would start the ritual all over again. The garden would be tilled. The pristine black dirt readied so that it could be carved into gridlines and rows for planting potatoes, onions, beans, tomatoes, cucumbers, and melons. I loved planting and tending the garden Grandpa and grandma sure appreciated the young back and knees I had for planting. I thought garden looked perfect on the day of planting. Why? There were no weeds to be found inside a freshly tilled garden.

Today, I am not so young as a once was. However, I have a garden freshly tilled ready for planting. I also have "home grown" young knees and backs waiting to plant and tend the perfect garden.

Sadly, like every year the perfect garden is ruined after time passes—Weeds—those pesky weeds! I remember, every now and then, Grandpa would exclaim out loud in the direction of Grandma—"O Eve, if you hadn't bit that apple!" Weeds are a sad reality, because they are a tangible reminder that both Adam and Eve fell head long into sin and with sin there are bound to be curses because of it. Grandpa would have to be on top of those weeds, before they overtook the garden and its fruits.

The prophet Isaiah shares God's vision of a vineyard—a garden—he provided everything that is necessary for a bountiful crop, but after time passed God did not find a bountiful crop but a "wild" crop. This was God calling Israel to repentance. He had brought them into the promised land and gave them prosperity and peace. The people responded with great outbursts of sin.

Any garden is not cared for will become so infested with weeds that it will be hard to distinguish what is a desirable plant with what is a weed. Likewise, when the garden of our hearts is not tended by God our hearts become infested with the "weeds" of sin. They're the roots of bitterness, envy, malice. Eventually if these weeds are not removed, they will choke and kill faith.

## "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." Hebrews 4:12

Thanks be to God that Jesus sends the Holy Spirit. He calls, gathers, enlightens, and keeps us in the one true faith. As he works in our lives, through God's Word and Sacrament, he produces in us a "new" heart of faith that produces the fruits of the Spirit.

"The works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." Galatians 5:19-23

I leave you with this beautiful prayer, written by Shelly Schwalm, in the current "Lutheran Life" magazine. It is going to be hanging on my wall soon:

"God of Creation, All creation sings Your praise and tells of Your glory. As I sit in this garden and tug up these weeds, I know my heart needs weeding like this overgrown plot. I confess my sins to You. As I uproot what invades the ground, uproot selfishness in my heart. Pull up the weeds of pride and judgment. Pull up the weeds of needing to be liked. Pull up the weeds of snark and complaining. Pull up the weeds of comparison and envy. Pull up the weeds of being harsh and hurried. Pull up the weeds of insecurity and isolation. Pull up the weeds where my love has lacked. Pull up the weeds in me, Lord, as my hands tug at these unruly roots. Let only the fruit of the Spirit bloom in this place. That the seeds of life from You, O Christ, would take root and grow as a tested tree, beautiful, steady, and pointing to the goodness of its Maker. Amen"
