Deuteronomy 6:6-7, "And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."



Dear Friends,

We are back to school. Wow....where did the summer go? In the spirit of "school," let me talk with you briefly about "Sunday School" and the importance of faith formation.

Let me first give you some interesting facts.

First, as reported by Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison, President of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, the LCMS has only retained 35 percent of our confirmands into adulthood (President's Report, Part 2).

Second, as listed in Haug and Warner, *Vol. 2 of Population Studies No. 31,* [Strasbourg 2000], when the father and mother attend church regularly, 33 percent of their children end up as regular churchgoers; when the mother attends regularly but the father is non-practicing, only two percent of their children become regular churchgoers; when the father attends regularly but the mother is non-practicing, 44 percent of the children become regular churchgoers.

Third, as reported by Nick Cady, *The Impact on Kids of Dad's Faith and Church Attendance*, June 20, 2016, <u>www.nickcady.org</u>, when both parents attend Bible study in addition to the Sunday service, 72 percent of their children attend Sunday School when grown; when only the father attends Sunday School, 55 percent of the children attend when grown; when only the mother attends Sunday School, 15 percent of the children attend when grown; when neither parent attends Sunday School, only six percent of the children attend when grown.

The Nick Cady survey also found that if a child is the first person in a household to become a Christian, there is a 3.5 percent probability everyone else in the household will follow; if the mother is the first to become a Christian, there is a 17 percent probability everyone else in the household will follow; when the father is first, there is a 93 percent probability everyone else in the household will follow.

It is the duty of parents to pass the faith on to their children. The surveys not only show this, but even before surveys were known, the Holy Scriptures taught us as much.

So, what do we do and where do we go from here? Let's start with prayer. Pray that the Lord God would give you strength and assistance in the task of raising your children in the faith. Pray that the Lord God is already raising up for them a Godly spouse. If your children are already grown and do not attend worship services regularly or at all, pray for them. We have this promise from Holy Scripture. "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6).



Next, be intentional, not only in praying for your children and teaching them how to pray, but also be intentional in setting aside time each evening (or morning, whatever works best in your schedule) for family devotions. You have the resources of the *Portals of Prayer* and *My Devotions* which are provided to you by the church as one such examples.

Finally, be intentional in coming to weekly church services. What you have been doing in the home throughout the week to find your "rest in Him," culminates on Sunday—the first day of the week, the day that we remember that our Savior was bodily raised from the grave. What a joy to gather together as the family of God—to hear His Word, to receive His forgiveness, and to study His Word.

Maybe you have no children. Maybe your children are grown and out of the house. Maybe you are an aunt or an uncle. Maybe you are the grandparent of children who do not attend church. What can you do to influence them with the Good News of Jesus Christ? What can you do to be a faith leader to them?

School has begun. I am simply urging and encouraging you to set aside time at home with the Lord and to finish that time each week by spending time with Him in the worship service and then with Sunday School. God be with you and strengthen you for the Godly vocation you have been given. ~ *Pastor Panzer*
