Kansas District Prayer Campaign: "Together We Pray"

The pandemic has made social distancing and going it alone the new normal. Here's an opportunity to buck that trend. On September 1, the Kansas District is kicking off a 90-day prayer campaign, "Together We Pray," which will include daily scripture verses and prayers through November 29, the first Sunday in Advent. If you're on Facebook, you can find the prayers on the Kansas District page (@kslcms). You can also find a booklet with all the prayers on the Kansas District website (kslcms.org), available August 31. Take a minute or two each day to join your fellow Kansans in prayer, with the confidence that He will hear us!

The following message is from the September 2020, Lutheran Witness KS District News, by Rev. Justin Panzer, District President:

We're in the middle of a long "day of trouble." People are sick and dying. They're lonely and afraid. We can't worship like we used to. We can't see the people we want to see. Restrictions and orders govern daily life. We continue to argue about the right course of action.

We need God. We need to be praying.

Prayer is part and parcel of the life of faith. Jesus Himself prayed often (Luke 5:16). He prayed by Himself and with His disciples (John 17:20). Paul tells the young pastor, Timothy, that it's good to pray for all people, especially for those in high positions (1 Tim. 2:1-5). Yes, we exercise our faith in a life of prayer (Matt. 21:22). Martin Luther said, "A Christian without prayer is just as impossible as a living person without a pulse." It's important for us to pray.

No doubt, there is fear and terror right now. We lament the challenges that we're facing (Ps. 130:1-2). In the face of this, Jesus says, "Fear not" (Luke 12:32) and tells us to come to Him (Matt. 11:28). So, we go to the Lord in prayer (Ps. 50:15), on our own and when we gather together.

Prayer is speaking to God in words and thoughts (Ps. 19:14). We pray in the name of Jesus (John 14:13-14), who now sits ascended at the right hand of God (Heb. 10:12). We pray for the forgiveness of our sins (Ps. 32:5). We give thanks for what we have received (Ps. 145:15-16). We should pray for everything we need, which is to the glory of God, and for both our own and our neighbor's welfare, temporal or spiritual.

But when we pray, we distinguish between temporal and spiritual benefits. For the former we always ask, "If You will," while for the latter we ask without condition. We also pray in order to praise God for His greatness and to thank Him for His many blessings (Phil. 4:6).

We pray whenever the need arises or the opportunity presents itself; in other words, we pray all the time. This doesn't mean that prayer must be constant speaking from morning until evening, nor that we need to engage in prayer marathons, but that our prayer life be a constant and consistent process. Our worship life is a great help in this regard. You see, prayer flows out of a life of worship (Col. 3:16). It's good for us to gather together (Heb. 10:25). Not only is it commanded by God, but church is the very place where you receive the gifts of our crucified and risen Savior for the forgiveness of your sins and the strengthening of your faith (Acts 2:42-43). Satan is attacking the body of Christ right now (1 John 4:4). Our spiritual body armor (Eph. 6:10-20) is taking a hit. The Word and Sacraments of Christ fortify the Christian believer in this time of testing (James 1:2-3, 12). Your pastors and church leaders are taking every precaution necessary to make sure that your churches are safe places to gather—and pray.







We're to pray not only in isolated circumstances or conditions, or in time of trouble, but always (1 Thess. 5:16-18). God has promised to hear and answer our prayer. He hasn't promised to answer our prayers the way or when we would like (James 1:6-7), but He will answer.

So let's pray — individually and collectively — as the body of Christ across Kansas. I invite you to participate with other LCMS Kansans in our "90 Days of Prayer," which began Sept. 1. Please take a minute or two each day to add your voice and pray the prayers, and encourage others to do the same.

You can find the daily prayers, which were developed by our district's circuit visitors and regional vicepresidents, on our Kansas District Facebook page and on our website (kslcms.org). Pray them. Share them. Take comfort in them. Let's pray for the end of this pandemic. Let's pray that we might not be fearful but trust in the Lord. Let's pray that our consciences might not be burdened but filled with joy.

Let's pray that our faith might not grow cold and that we might live at peace with one another. Let's pray in confidence (1 John 5:14), trusting that "Thy will be done" (Matt. 6:10)!
